Professor Ian Frazer AC

FRS, FRSE, FAA, FAHMS, BSc (Hons), MB ChB, MD, DSc (h c) (Ed), FRCP(Ed), FRCPA, FAICD, FTSE, FRACGP, FRACOG (Hon), FASM

Professor Ian Frazer is a clinician scientist, trained as a clinical immunologist in Scotland. As a professor at the University of Queensland, Ian leads a research group working at TRI in Brisbane, Australia on the immunobiology of epithelial cancers.

He is recognised as co-inventor of the technology enabling the HPV vaccines, currently used worldwide to help prevent cervical cancer.

Professor Frazer heads a biotechnology company, Jingang Medicine (Aus) Pty Ltd, working on new vaccine technologies, and is a board member of several companies and not for profit organisations.

lan was the inaugural president of the Australian Academy of Health and Medical Sciences, and a member of the Australian National Science and Technology Council.

Professor Frazer chairs the Australian Medical Research Advisory Board of the Medical Research Future Fund.

Dr Young is Queensland's Chief Health Officer and also occupies the roles of Deputy Director-General Prevention Division and Chief Medical Officer. She has specialist qualifications as a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Medical Administrators and as a Fellow by Distinction of the Faculty of Public Health of the Royal College of Physicians of the United Kingdom. She has Adjunct Professor appointments at Griffith University, Queensland University of Technology and the University of Queensland.

Her role includes responsibility for health disaster planning and response; aeromedical retrieval services; licensing of private hospitals and schools of anatomy; policy and compliance regarding organ and tissue donation, blood, medicines and poisons, cancer screening, communicable diseases, environmental health, preventive health; and medical workforce planning and leadership.

Dr Young is a member of numerous state and national committees and boards including at a national level the National Health and Medical Research Council, Australian Health Protection Principal Committee, Jurisdictional Blood Committee, Standing Committee on Screening, Jurisdictional Advisory Group on Organ and Tissue Donation, Medical Workforce Reform Advisory Committee, Australian Strategic Advisory Group on Antimicrobial Resistance, Population Health Research Network Participant Council, and the National Advisory Council on Medicinal Cannabis.

At a State level Dr Young is a member of the Executive Directors of Medical Services Forum, the Clinical Senate, Radiation Health Advisory Committee, Great Start DDG Cluster Group, and Keeping Queenslanders Health DDG Cluster Group. She is Chair of the Medical Schools Liaison Committee, the Mass Gatherings Committee, the Regional Medical Program Steering Committee, and the Real Time Reporting Strategic Oversight Committee.
