Professor Elizabeth Molloy

Department of Medical Education, Melbourne Medical School, The University of Melbourne.

Liz Molloy is Professor of Work Integrated Learning in the School of Medicine at the University of Melbourne and Director of Interprofessional Education and Practice in the Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences. Liz's work seeks to better understand how students learn through the clinical workplace, including how they seek and interpret cues within their contexts.

Liz trained as a physiotherapist, and her interest in health professions education prompted her to return to the University of Melbourne to complete a PhD (2006) on feedback in clinical education. Liz has published more than 120 peer reviewed journal articles, book chapters and books, with a focus on feedback and assessment, workplace learning, transitions, and interprofessional education.

Liz received an inaugural Fellowship of ANZAHPE in 2015, and is Associate Editor of the journal's Advances in Health Sciences Education and Focus on Health Professions Education. In 2019 Liz received a Karolinska Fellowship Prize for Excellence in Research in Medical Education.
